The practice is reviewed from time to time and the quantum of contribution is increased s per the demand. At the start of the current year the amount collected was Rs. 1.20 lakh. Now it is rose up to Rs. 3.90 lacs from more than 45 donors. The accumulated interest amount on the deposits is distributed to the beneficiaries at the annual day function or at the time of admission. Generally the total disbursement amount has been approximately Rs. 50000/- to the awardees every year. The names of those who need help generally come from their fellow students or the faculty in the college. The proposals are examined by the bursar in the form of scrutiny of supporting papers such as BPL ration card, income certificate or other relevant proofs. The list of beneficiaries is finalized in consultation with the Principal and senior faculty members. Some students receive help right at the entry point in the form of admission fees charges also.

The impression has been tremendous, indeed much more than envisaged. There is an all-round awareness amongst the students to look for anyone who needs economic help. The success of the practice can be gauged from the students' constant demand to strengthen the endowment.
